Virtual Learning Tips

- •Maintain a schedule for your child, as if they are coming to school. Have them brush their teeth, eat breakfast, and be dressed before class begins. (It will start the day off in a more familiar consistent pattern with that of school.)
- •Avoid learning in a bed, a couch, or too cozy of a chair. Find a table, desk or flat surface for the student to set their device on and have space for writing.
- •Headphones are fantastic when you have multiple children participating at once.
- •Eliminate distractions: Loud televisions, video games, or a busy room might not be best for students to focus.
- •Frequently check in-make sure that you child is engaged at participating in a way that you would expect for learning.
