Social-Emotional Learning

During the month of August, our theme is embracing our school as a welcoming place where every student feels like he or she belongs to our community. In our classroom meetings, we'll be reminding students to welcome others to act and speak in safe, kind, responsible and respectful ways. In addition we'll be teaching students the Evergreen Union School District creed.

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We'll also continue teaching the *Second Step* program in all grades which includes lessons that support this creed. This program directly teaches students the skills that strengthen their ability to learn, have empathy, manage emotions, and solve problems. We want your child to be successful in school, and that means going beyond the basics. Excelling in academics is important, but students also need to know how to learn, make good decisions, handle strong emotions, and get along with others.

We encourage you to support your child at home in welcoming others and acting and speaking in safe, kind, responsible, and respectful ways. For our middle school parents, Second Step provides a FREE resource ParenTeenConnect.org; it provides expert advice and practical tools for dealing with real parent-teen issues. Please ask your child's teacher if you have questions about specific ways you can help your child with these behaviors at home.

Academic Learning

Upon return to school, students in all grade levels will be focused on academic learning. Teachers across all grade levels will be focused on ensuring all students develop literacy skills using the Evergreen Union School District Literacy Habits of Mind:

- Content knowledge solving complex problems with no obvious answer through content rich text
- Language development developing language by building full concept knowledge, learning words in meaningful context, and independently using word strategies
- Meaning making reading to infer, interpret, draw

conclusions and resolve conflicting views

• Effective expression - constructing viable arguments with evidence in speaking and writing

In addition, our students will be exposed to learning English Language Arts, History-Social Science, Mathematics, and Science curriculums. Teachers have spent time this summer and during their Professional Development days to long- and short-term plan engaging and supportive lessons for your child in these as well as other supportive areas.

We encourage you to support your child at home in developing their academic skills. Homework assigned to that end will support continued practice. Please contact your child's teacher if you have questions about additional specific ways you can support your child at home.

Cell Phone Policy

Cell phones (and other communication devices like smart watches) have become a way of life, a technological convenience that has impacted all of our lives in one way or another. However, in the school environment, they have become a distraction, interruption, and a method of inappropriate exchange of information. The ringing of the cell phone during class or text-messaging takes away from valuable time needed for instruction and most importantly, student learning. We do recognize that cell phones can be a safety/ security tool; however, they can be a detriment in the event of a building emergency and our protocol to manage such emergencies in a safe and effective manner.

The policy at Evergreen Union School District is: students are not allowed to use a cell phone, smart watch, and/or any other communication device during school hours (including morning and afterschool day care). All devices must be turned off and secured by the students. Of course, the best security is to leave the device at home. If it is necessary to confiscate your child's device because it was out and visible, the following steps will be taken:

- 1st offense cell phone (device) is taken by the teacher/staff and returned at the end of the period.
- 2nd offense- cell phone (device) is taken by teacher/staff, labeled and sent to the office to be picked up by parents/guardians.
- Future offenses: additional offenses and/or a student that refuses to comply with a request to surrender their cell phone (device) by any member of the faculty or staff and/or administrator, will be considered insubordinate resulting in further discipline.

Thank you in advance for partnering with us in order to provide a safe, productive, engaging, learning environment for all of our students. If, in the event you need to relay an urgent message to your child, please call the school office and our secretaries will ensure that your child gets the message.

Please remember that all transportation changes need to be in writing.

Dress Code

- Pants/shorts must be worn at the belt line above the hips, no sagging pants
- Hats/caps cannot be worn inside any buildings and must be worn facing forward at all times
- All attire worn (garments, hats, socks, shoes) is in good taste for the school environment and free of de pictions of violence, profanity, drugs or alcohol, ra cial or off color comments/references, sex or gangs. Bandannas are allowed on declared spirit days only
- Footwear must be worn at all times. For safety pur poses, sandals must have a heel strap. No flip flops, slippers, or backless shoes allowed.
- Undergarments are not to be exposed at any time (underwear, boxers, bra, or bra straps)
- Tops must be modest and midriffs covered at all times in ALL activities, even when arms are raised
- No low cut, halter, tube or strapless tops
- No loose fitting muscle shirts
- 1" wide straps are appropriate

Students are asked to stay home for this event per Tehama County Public Health Guidance; we must limit the number of individuals in each classroom and want to be sure all parents/ guardians are able to hear the important information shared by their child's teacher. Per CDPH Guidelines, face coverings are required on all school campuses when inside. Thank you for your cooperation.

First Day Happenings

Per TCPH Guidance, we are not required at this transmission rate to do student screenings at the curb. As such, all parents are invited to walk their child to class on the first day of school. Classrooms will open at 8:00am; teachers will be preparing prior to that time. Please remember that per CDPH face coverings are required on all school campuses when inside.
